- After reading non-fiction text, small groups of students take turns thinking and making notes on each Application "C", then take turns sharing their thinking.
- How to start Teach one "C" at a time by first defining it, then modelling it in a think-aloud, then practicing as a whole class, gradually releasing responsibility to students. When all students can do the "C", allow groups of 3-4 to work together to process what they have read. This is called the "I do, we do, you do" instructional model.



### The Accelerative Integrated Methodology (AIM)

... a highly effective method used to learn languages.

This drama-based method uses story-telling, gestures, active collaboration and repetition to enhance oral language skills in French. This method is being used at EDM.
