


The search is on for the "Hidden Apprentices."

If you know of a secondary school student who is currently working in a trade occupation, they may already be eligible to become a secondary school apprentice and not know it. These students are our "hidden apprentices"! Students, as early as Grade 10, can register as a secondary Youth Work in Trades and be able to receive dual credits and get a head start on earning their trade certification. This program provides a smooth transition from school to work with the opportunity to qualify for a \$1000 scholarship.



# "Disciplinary Literacy"

"Disciplinary Literacy" focuses on the development of specialized thinking processes and reading strategies used by the experts of a particular subject area. This approach emphasizes the idea that students can "think like a scientist" rather than learn about Science—moving them from outsiders to insiders, and potentially increasing the authenticity and relevance of their studies. While traditional approaches successfully equip students to read for understanding, students may struggle as they advance into middle and high school, where they will need to navigate increasingly complex, subject-specific texts. Disciplinary Literacy can help students to make sense of these texts if they better understand the particular thinking routines and text structures in disciplines such as Math, Physics, Forestry, Woodwork, Mechanics, and all others.
